As a community foundation, we at FPM promote sustainable community development in Punta de Mita and around the Bay of Banderas in areas of community development, education, evironment and health.





EDUCATION | COMPAS - YOUTH FOR THE FUTURE

COMPAS is a program designed to promote the completion of teenagers in our local high schools. The program structure and activities are based on research showing that strong interpersonal relationships, strengthening of self-esteem and family support are vital for student motivation and reducing high school dropouts. COMPAS began in 2018 through the Bronfman Family Fund.

This 2019 the number of members increased from 8 a 14 students from the two high schools in the Punta de Mita region. Where there have been changes in the boys and girls of the program to improve their communication and resilience, and to go thinking about the steps they need to take to meet their life goals.

We are thrilled to be able to present the first 2 high school graduates who also graduated from COMPAS: Andrea Estela Bercerra López and Damaris Isabel Saldaña Soto. Damaris is not only studying Administration but has also been hired by the Foundation as an administrative assistant, helping her to finance her studies while gaining valuable professional experience.

What our COMPAS students say about the program:

The COMPAS program includes:

- 50 personal development workshops for 69 high school students
- 1-day leadership retreat
- · Books, uniforms, schools supplies, transportation
- 2 local university visits
- 93 personal guidance sessions
- 59 family guiadance sessions

EDUCATION | PUBLIC SHOOL SUPPORT

Support for Public Schools

There are 11 public schools K-12 in the three towns we serve, and there are several ways that we work with them. In 2019, FPM sponsored 8 community residents to participate in the **II International Conference for Community Resilience**, as well as being a link between several donors and schools. Two international corporations that donated to public schools were **3Form**, helping children to paint the exterior of the school and a beautiful mural, and **Nike**, whose participants assembled 20 children's bicycles that were later raffled to 5th grade students.

Grants for Public Schools

During our grant period for public schools in 2019, we learned about the importance of recognizing the distinct needs of each school, and so decided to accept a broader range of projects. Each school had to raise at least \$5,000 pesos and received \$20,000 pesos more, in addition to guidance throughout the process. We were pleased to see an increase in participation from 3 schools in 2018 to 8 schools in 2019.

HEALTH | SPORTS CENTER


2019 began with the inauguration of the new cement bleachers, thanks to the generous support of the **Bronfman Family Fund**.

Activities continue, including 7 soccer teams, taekwondo and zumba. This year was focused on **inviting community participation** in brainstorming additional activities that could be offered at the Sports Center, in particular, working with the 4th and 5th grade students at the 4 elementary schools, who drew their ideas of their ideal sports center.

These drawings were then shown to a local architect, who designed a master plan. We then took this plan back to the community for feedback, and so forth.

This method of participative planning has been our focus in community development and leads to a stronger sense of ownership.



















HEALTH | HEALTH IN YOUR HANDS

In 2019, after completing the pilot project of "Health in your Hands" and with the results on the health care needs of the population, clinics were programmed for community members with the alliance of the Centro Universitario de la Costa, St Regis and Punta de Mita Hospital. With a local volunteer, we also performed Dental evaluations with 180 children in 2 primary schools and one preschool, registering 78 children with dental problems. Children also received Informative talks on oral hygiene and received 180 toothbrushes.

In conjuntion with OcuClinika in Bucerias, we performed Vision Clinics with 102 students at four local elementary schools. Of the reviewed students, 65% needed glasses.




HEALTH | HEALTH IN YOUR HANDS

World Kindey Day is the beginning of clinics for the care of the population on topics such as: risk factors for hypertension, high sodium intake, anxiety and depression. Attendees included 4 older adults, 16 adults between 30 to 58 years old and 2 young people of 17 and 27 years old, respectively.

The participating doctors were from various faculties in the country, including the UNAM, the University of Guadalajara, CMQ Riviera Nayarit, the Instituto Nacional de Cardiología Ignacio Chávez, the Autonomous University of Hidalgo, and students of the 7th semester of Nutrition at CUC University.

Students from CUC University gave workshops on nutrition and diabetes for the elderly, including topics such as diabetes care, healthy eating, foods with high sugar content and cooking.



Hospital Punta de Mita participated in the First Aid Training for the start of the summer course called CurioCity, in which 15 participants from 5 nonprofits were trained.

ENVIRONMENT | ECO-MITA

Eco-Mita is an integral program the conservation of our natural resources and environmental awareness in the populations that we serve.

Grants- The EcoMita grant was awarded this year to a community group called "Mita Bonita" (Beautiful Mita), led by 3 women from Punta de Mita and including around 50 kids. With their project, they held talks in the community about how to care for the environment, they organized cleaning campaigns, bought, painted and installed 60 garbage bins around town, planted around 300 Trees, and painted two Murals, always with the goal of making their town a better place.

Recycling for Art

With the help of 30 children from town, we were able to finish our mural of the ocean at the Del Mar Community Center. The project included collecting trash, cleaning it, and imagining how to use it to create the animal and plant life for the mural, giving a new use for the materials that we found and owning our public spaces at Del Mar.

Environmental Education for our Youth

In December we invited the nonprofit Bird Observatory of San Pancho to speak with 72 middle and high school students in two of our towns. The students were introduced to information about the ecosystems that surround us, in particular the wide array of bird species. Each student also each received the beautiful *Viva Natura* field guide by regional photographer/author Petr Myska.

Recycling station

The Del Mar recycling station collected a total of 901.5 kg of recyclable waste in 2019, with the participation of families and businesses in the community. The stations were built by the Mita Recicla community group in 2017 with a grant awarded by Fundación Punta de Mita.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT | DEL MAR COMMUNITY CENTER

Del Mar Community Center

The Del Mar Community Center has the mission of creating a recreational space open to the entire community. In 2019 we had visits from 1,285 boys and girls, 420 adults, 206 senior citizens and 80 young people ten ayers.

We coordinated 14 children's workshops, 4 courses officially certified by SEP through ICATEN and 8 workshops for adults, all of them promoted by the community.

We held these events for the community in 2019:


- The inauguration of the Community Garden with the elderly as godparents.
- Capturing the needs of the **Sports Center** with participatory methods.
- The celebration of Family Day with affection, appreciation and value for the achievements of children.
- Our Communtity Posada.



During the summer we held a course called CurioCity with 44 children and 7 nonprofits as special guests who helped us explore the world. The children who attended experienced moments of knowledge and meaningful games that will remain in their childhood memories.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT | DEL MAR COMMUNITY CENTER

In 2019 we started a Mañanas Divertidas (Enjoyable mornings) program with the support of the Amigas of Punta de Mita for children who attend school in the afternoon shift.

The primary objective is to develop life skills like emotional, environmental, motor and musical intelligence, healthy habits and oral hygiene. We were able to offer breakfasts, thanks to funding for one semester, which children learned to appreciate new types of fruits and vegetables. We also worked with them on oral hygiene.



At the Del Mar Community Center, we were able to create alliances with the Ministry of Public Education for a Mathematics Competition, and environmental fair with the CONANP (National Commission of Natural Protected Areas)



St. Regis worked with once a month with 60 senior citizens from our three towns, offering information on nutrition, exercising, and other methods of self-care, while enjoying good company and music.



In 2019 we welcomed 113 volunteers with a total of 1.088 hours of service.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT | REGIONAL SUPPORT

We continue with our objective of strengthening other nonprofits throughout the region in a profound way, with long-term impact. It is very gratifying to see these groups put into practice the information and tools that they receive through our training. Below are the three primary ways that we work with other nonprofits in Puerto Vallarta and Bahía de Banderas:

15FIA

3rd Regional Meeting of Social Organizations

 With the theme "Strong foundations for strong Alliances," 31 nonprofits participated in the exploration of how to improve the administration and transparency of their organization in order to generate better alliances with other sectors.

15th International Altruism Festival

- Organized by the Marriott Resort y Fundación Punta de Mita, it raised \$757,677 MXN for 20 organizatons with the help of 1,200 participants and 50 companies.
 - Another alliance we had in 2019 was with the American Consulate and
- Pro-Sociedad, a sustainable development agency located in Guadalajara, bringing to Puerto Vallarta a cycle of activities aimed at the private, public and social sector of Bahía de Banderas.



ProMita grants

With the money that is raised at the **Charity Golf Classic** each year, Fundación Punta de Mita invites community groups to design and present their projects. This year, the Senior Citizens Clubs of Higuera Blanca and Nuevo Corral del Risco entered for the first time, installing windows and replacing the ceiling fans and bathroom doors at their Clubhouses.

FOROB GRANTS STRENGTHENING GRASSROOTS ORGANIZATIONS

Fundación Punta de Mita uses its grant programs as an extension of its training program; not only giving resources, but also providing advice and support in order to ensure the successful completion of their projects.

In 2019, FPM supported **5 Projects** through our **FOROB** grants (Strengthening Grassroots Organizations), for a total of **\$214,358 MXN**. This was achieved with the support of an alliance with the **Global Fund for Community Foundations**, focusing on projects that encourage strong community engagement throughout the process. For this, we organized a two-day workshop on community participatory methods in alliance with **Nuiwari AC**.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT FUNDS (CD-FUNDS)



FPM continues to operate as a **key regional entity** in its support for and collaboration with other nonprofits and grassroots goups in the Bay of Banderas, both in Nayarit and Jalisco. In 2019, 13 organizations had active CD-Funds and were able to mobilize a total of **\$2,110,110 MXN** in donations from Mexico, the U.S. and Canada through the Foundation. In addition to mobilizing funds the Foundation provides CD-Fund holders a number of services, financial administration of projects, monthly reports, mentoring and capacity training.




