Additionally, through our membership in COMUNALIA (Mexican National Association of Community Foundations), matching funds were approved for distribution in 2015. These actions confirm FPM's continued commitment to its donors that it will do everything possible to maximize each and every cent that is donated to FPM.

In 2014, FPM was honored to receive the highest level Certificate of Fiscal Transparency from CEMEFI, one of Mexico's oldest and most trusted organizations. This, together with the fact that since its inception FPM has an external audit each and every year, FPM has become a partner that donors and other nonprofit organizations in the region trust and want to work with. Each month we have more organizations who join our FUNDS program, which provides them with much needed assistance, networking, training and other capabilities not otherwise accessible.

#### How we work

Fundación Punta de Mita works under the Community Foundation model. Community Foundations are instruments of civil society designed to involve all the participants of positive change in the development of the community. They focus on Grassroots Development: building capacities, empowering what already exists, strengthening organizations, creating networks, promoting sustainability, generating social capital, and promoting citizenship. As a Community Foundation, Fundación Punta de Mita runs its own community programs and projects as well as supports other organizations, and sometimes functions as a grant-making entity.

We believe in an integral approach to four pillars-Education, Health, Community Development, and Environment- they must grow together and level to provide a strong foundation for our community and our region as a whole. ### This year was an important one for Fundación Punta de Mita in the field of Education:

- **ab.** We received our first ever federal grant through SEDESOL (Mexican Department of Social Development) to build two fully equipped elementary-school kitchens, one in Emiliano Zapata and the other in Higuera Blanca. The program was rounded out by also providing each school with garden plots, the necessary materials for the children to grow their own vegetables, and parent sessions with a nutritionist from Guadalajara University to come up with a balanced and economic menu for school lunches. Having these kitchens allows the schools be part of the DIF's breakfast program, guaranteeing a nutritious breakfast every day before school starts. Overall, 420 students were benefited this year, with hundreds more in the years to come.
- c. 2014-2015 is also the last year for FPM's final two scholarship students, Alex Giobanni Guzmán Cano and Juan Manuel Valencia Galeana at Costa Verde International School elementary in Sayulita. Here they received an exceptional and fully bilingual education which will allow them to pursue bigger and better things, and someday come back to help improve their communities. Giobanni and Juan Manuel we wish you the best of luck!
- **d.** We continued to support maestra Carmen as a second teacher in the Corral del Risco Kindergarten. Having personalized attention and low studentto-teacher ratios at this stage of development is crucial, allowing these 37 children

- e. The middle school in Emiliano Zapata received some much needed love thanks to the volunteers and donations from PhPproductions. With their donation, we replaced the worn-out patio benches (which the evening high school students use as a classroom) with three colored concrete benches and tables. We also spent a day with the middle school students and Phproductions volunteers painting three student-designed murals and re-painting the school entrance logos. As a part f this renovation, we also coordinated with the municipality so that they would come repaint the rest of the school walls
- **f.** Finally, thanks to a generous donation from Epicor as part of their company retreat, we were able to start refurbishing 150 school desks, replacing the old wooden panels with colorful, 100% recycled plastic boards. Students should feel proud and welcome in school facilities which are in good conditions. The chairs will be distributed to 10 public schools in the region. This project will continue in 2015.



- **a.** 2014 was a huge success for the highway cleanup program both in quantity and in quality. The Jaguar Warriors picked up 2,307 large bags of garbage from the 20km stretch of highway between La Cruz and Punta de Mita. The group has grown to 110 volunteers who clean up the highway monthly in rotating groups of 40 monthly cleanup. Not only are more people participating in the program, but they are also taking new initiatives; they suggested also cleaning the gullies between the mountains where large amounts of garbage accumulate. Another big stride forward is the alliance that has been formed with Riviera Nayarit's Visitors and Conventions Bureau, who donate the garbage bags, gloves, and water bottles for the cleanup. (the cost of this program is included in community development, as they function as a community volunteer group)
- **b.** This year also saw the continued implementation of the environmental education program designed by EntreAmigos, Discovering Ourselves in the EcoNet. 20 local university students, trained by EntreAmigos and FPM staff, volunteered their time to complete the 20 units of the program to 14 elementary school groups in Bahía de Banderas public schools. This means that over 500 students learned about their role and responsibility for the environment through specially designed games and activities.

Of course, children and adults alike are more likely to care for the natural environment if they are surrounded by it, and truly get to understand the wonders it holds. Towards this end, FPM has been involved with two projects:

- c. First, the greening of all the public schools of Higuera Blanca- Kindergarten, Elementary, Middle and High School. Robert Dahl nurseries generously donated trees, shrubs and decorative plants to these four schools, as studies have proven that playing regularly in natural areas dramatically improves symptoms and behavior issues of ADHD, it benefits motor coordination skills, it heightens creativity, even language skills are enhanced as children push themselves to understand, describe, and interact with a much more complex environment.
- **e.** Second, the FPM continues with the distribution and promotion of VivaNatura: Field guide to the amphibians, reptiles, birds and mammals of Western Mexico, by Petr Myska. This fully bilingual and stunningly beautiful book allows the reader to recognize and understand the animals which share our surroundings, in the hopes of increasing awareness and the will to protect them. Pending importing and transportation fees were paid this year.

### **COMMUNITY (2)** DEVELOPMENT

In order to create a long-lasting change, Fundacion Punta de Mita believes in strengthening the community and all of its actors to drive this change from within (as opposed to an assistencialism approach, where the recipients are passive subjects). This is translated into action in several different ways: Giving non-profits and community groups platforms to promote themselves, working on building networks and support systems, training and professionalization of non-profits (including FPM's own staff), and giving out community grants for projects that will benefit the entire community.

### **COMMUNITY (2)** DEVELOPMENT



- **a.** FPM participated in two networking and training opportunities this year. First, our Communications Coordinator and our Executive Director received their Community Foundation Leadership Certificate from the Mexico's Community Foundation Alliance (Comunalia). This not only gave them valuable skills, new connections, and practical exercises to improve the Foundation, but it also included a week-long internship to learn about the strengths and lessons from other Community Foundations in Mexico. Our executive Director also participated in the XII Iberoamerican Symposium, with the main theme this year of "Participating in new roles and experiences for the Civic Sector". The non-profit sector is undergoing many changes in Mexico, and FPM is proud to be at the forefront of these new analyses, working with others and looking to have a lasting effect in the public policy which regulates them.
- c. There are many organizations in the region that do amazing work, however, often times they do not have the proper platform to share their accomplishments, invite the general public to their events, or ask for donations and volunteers. In 2014, Fundacion Punta de Mita provided just that to over 40 non-profits and grassroots groups through the FPM-hosted show, "El Foco," on Jalisco State Radio and online. Guests came to talk about their organizations' activities, as well as present obstacles, solutions, and interesting dilemmas Mexican non-profits face.

- **d.** Additionally, FPM awarded a much larger grant to fully fund PEACE Punta de Mita's 2014 summer camp. The camp was a huge success with approximately 120 attending. They were kept busy and happy with activities, games, and crafts for two weeks.
- **f.** Fundación Punta de Mita also has a program of "community grants," which lend a hand to community initiatives and events which benefit everyone. This year, FPM gave two small grants, for the Mother's Day Celebration in Emiliano Zapata and Corral del Risco's Patron Saint Celebration. Over 2,000 people were benefited in these two towns during these celebrations.

Good Health is one of the fundamental bases of human well-being. As such, Fundacion Punta de Mita strives to provide the community with the tools and spaces to lead an active and healthy lifestyle. A main part of this is the Punta de Mita Community Sports Center.

**Sports Center.** Fundacion Punta de Mita works hard to maintain the almost 10,000 square meter facility in optimal shape, using its resources to repair facilities from the normal wear and tear, keep bathrooms and public spaces clean, maintain the grass fields in good condition, and pay instructors to give classes to the public. The Sports Center Facilities include regulation size soccer field, basketball/volleyball court, small multipurpose field, multipurpose activities space, kids jungle-gym, and bathrooms for its **over 350 weekly users.** 

The Sports Center serves the communities of Higuera Blanca, Emiliano Zapata and Corral del Risco, as well as the countless others who visit the Sports Center during its open classes, sports tournaments and other activities. With its weekly **zumba**, **volleyball**, **soccer**, **and aerobics classes**, it has become a focal point for community building and healthy interactions. It has also become a rallying point were community, the municipality and local organizations (including FPM) must work together in order to achieve true sustainability, this will be the Foundation's main focus moving forward with the Sports Center.

## COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT FUNDS

### **ACTION IN LA CRUZ**

1. Group of highly involved Cruz de Huanacaxtle residents looking to improve the conditions of their town. Funds allowed them to complete two months of beach and town clean-up, and volunteer-for-food program.



### **ANGELS**

2. This wonderful group of philanthropic women in Punta Mita have been working tirelessly for a few years now, raising funds to invest in innovative projects to improve the lives of community members. This year, the Angels were the benefactors of another one of our Funds, Bienestares AC.

### **BIENESTARES AC**

3. Believes that before anything else can improve, there must be a strong push towards Human Development. Taking the family as a natural unit on which to focus this development, Bienestares holds self-awareness and development workshops for children, teenagers, and parents through the generous donations of the Angels.

### FIRE EMS

**4.** As part of "Firefighter's Crossing Borders" efforts to renew and revamp the emergency services in the entire Bay of Banderas, Fire EMS works to train both professional and volunteer life-guards in the communities close to Punta de Mita. Partially with funds received through their FPM fund, this year Fire EMS was able to bring six fire instructors form the US to hold workshops for approximately 100 trainees, repair a service truck, and buy uniforms. Fire Fighters Crossing Borders is also working together with the Asociación Regional de Bomberos, local Rotary Clubs, local fire departments, and Pro-Sayulita.

### **MANTA PROJECT**

**5.** As part of a global initiative to study oceanic manta rays, researchers from Scripps Institute for Oceanography visited our shores and found a surprising aggregation of Manta Rays on the southern end of our Bay. They are now conducting year-round research in Yelapa, training local biology students to carry out these investigations, and creating awareness among the fishermen community.

### **RETO**

6. (Turtle Camp Network)- Wanting to help both the large amount of turtles which arrive on our shores, as well as the many committed turtle-camp conservationists, ReTo was born to create an organizational and collaborative network between them. The turtle camp network now includes thirteen (and growing) camps, all down the coast of Nayarit, and down to Cabo Corrientes. With the money raised through FPM, ReTo was able to repair and maintain turtle camps damaged by the severe storm surges we experienced this year, allowing them to safeguard over 1.000 nests.

**8.** Is the champion for Whale Conservation and Ecology within the Banderas Bay. They approach the problem from all sides; holding certification workshops for tour-operators, educational talks for schoolchildren and media awareness campaigns. They maintain an impressive database of humpback whale sightings (using their caudal fins as "fingerprints"), researching their migratory, mating and calving patterns. They also are some of the original founders of RABEN, a network of professionals trained to aid whales in distress caught in drifting fishing nets.

**9.** Is directed towards children in elementary school, "Where children learn how to learn" with ages from 5-12 years old. The program is not only about dance. It's about providing the kids with the tools to gain improved concentration, commitment to apply what they learn; better life habits and put them in contact with music and what it represents.

Their music and choreography for 2014 was based on Dr. Seuss's creation, "The Lorax." Through this fun show, presented by over 150 children at the Punta de Mita Sports Center, childeren not only had a ton of fun, they also improved their concentration and motor skills, as well as learned ecological values.

#### PRESENT:

Please find attached herewith the financial statements of the FUNDACION PUNTA DE MITA, A.C., which include the statements financial situation from December 31, 2014, the activities and cash flow statements up to December 31 2012 and 2014, as well as a resumed report of the main accounting policies and some explaining information.

#### The Administration Responsibility in Relation to the Financial Statements

The Administration is responsible for the preparation and reasonable presentation of the attached financial statements pursuant to the Mexican Financial Information Norms, and to the internal control that, according to the administration policies, may be necessary to allow the preparation of financial statements free from material deviations derived from errors or frauds.

#### The Auditor's Responsabilities

Our responsibility consists in uttering an opinion on the attached financial statements based on our auditing activities. We have carried out our auditing tasks pursuant to the International Auditing Norms. Said norms imply the fulfillment of the ethical requirements and the practice of the auditing task with the aim of obtaining a reasonable assurance that the financial statements are free from material deviations.

The auditing process includes different methods aimed to obtain auditing evidences on the expended amounts and to gather information from the financial statements. The selected procedures depend upon the auditing party's judgment, including the evaluation of the risks of the financial statements material deviations derived from errors or frauds. By means of the above mentioned evaluations of the risks, the auditor takes into consideration the Company internal control required to reasonably prepare and present the financial statements, with the aim of designing suitable auditing methods according to the circumstances and not with the aim of expressing an opinion on the competence of the internal control of the Association.

An auditory task also includes the evaluation on the relevance of the accounting methods applied by the administration, as well as a whole evaluation of the financial statements presentation

#### Foundation of the opinion without qualification

I think that the evidence of audit that I have obtained in my audit provides a base sufficient and adapted to sustain my opinion without qualification.

#### Our Opinion

We are of the opinion, the financial statements reasonably reflect, in all the material features, the **FUNDACIÓN PUNTA DE MITA**, **A.C.**. financial situation, up to December 31, 2014, including the results and the cash flow of the fiscal exercises that came to an end on said dates, pursuant to the Mexican Financial Information Norms.
